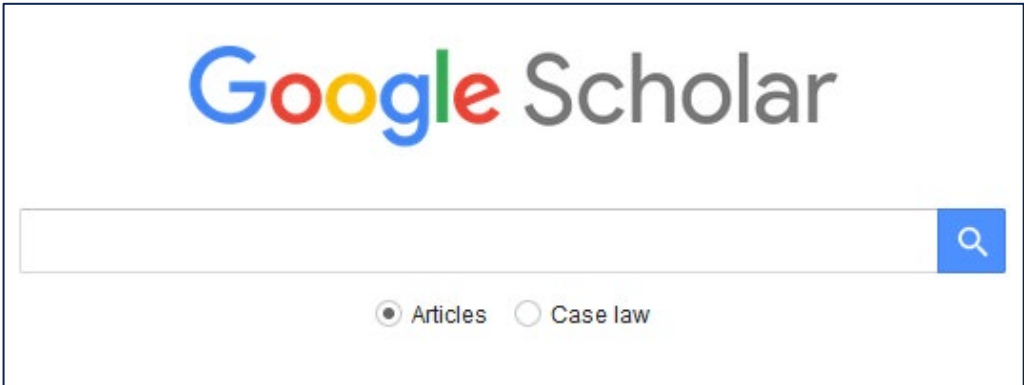


## What is Google Scholar?

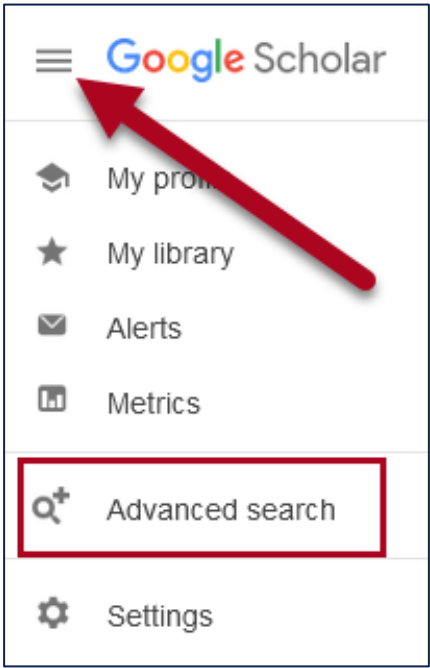
Google Scholar provides you with a simple way to access scholarly literature online, most of which is free. Resources include, but are not limited to, articles, theses, and court opinions. You can access this resource by going to <https://scholar.google.com/>

## How to search Google Scholar

**Basic Search:** Type keywords related to your topic into the basic search box. Then select the magnifying glass or hit Enter on your keyboard to complete the search.



**Advanced Search:** Select the three lines in the top left corner of the screen, and then select Advanced Search. An advanced search will allow you to find articles that contain specific words or return articles by a certain author or publication.



**Please note:** Not all results will provide access to the full-text of the article. If the full-text is available, you'll see a link to the right of the citation. If the full-text is unavailable check the UAGC library to see if it is part of our collection. If not, you may be able to request the resource through [Interlibrary Loan](#).

## Additional Features

Google Scholar has some great features, many of which can be accessed by clicking on the icons found underneath each article abstract:



The star icon allows you to add the resource to your personal Google Scholar library. Be sure to sign in to (or create) your Google account if you plan to use this feature.



The quotation mark icon allows you to cite the resource in a variety of formats, including APA. Be sure to double check these citations against the information in the [Writing Center](#).



The Cited by link allows you to access the full list of all resources that cited the selected resource.



The Related articles link allows you to view a list of articles related to the selected resource.
